Support is matched to individual school need. It aims to support leaders to build capacity and sustainability in changes to their mathematics curriculum and teaching and learning across school.

Targeted Support in Maths supports Primary and Secondary schools to make sustained change in maths over an agreed number of days through one of two ways:

Intensive Support

For schools not currently engaged with other Teaching for Mastery Programmes. It supports the school and its staff, ready for future Hub engagement.

Schools work closely with an Intensive Support Partner (ISP) to explore current practice, plan sustained development of mathematics across school, and evaluate impact.

Typically, schools receive several visits over an agreed period, to support the embedding of planned actions. Planning and evaluation is a shared process.

Successful Intensive Support will:

- clarify the school's vision for maths
- support development of an implementation plan to help the school move towards its maths vision enable the school to feel ready to join our Teaching for Mastery Programme.

Enhanced Support

Enhanced support works alongside current Maths Hub activity, complementing engagement in other Work Groups, and strengthening existing practices.

Schools work closely with a Local Leaders of Maths Education (LLME), in order to increase the impact of their current Hub Work Group.

Typically, schools receive several visits over an agreed period, to support the embedding of planned actions. Planning and evaluation is a shared process.

Successful Enhanced Support will:

- ensure schools are effective in developing good maths understanding for all pupils
- enable a school to confidently feel they belong within the Teaching for Mastery Programme
